The most surprising and delightful part of the experience was how God's word came alive. Seven times a day, I read a chapter of John and a psalm, then spent a few minutes meditating on them. Though I have read John many times, it came to life with richness and power as never before! I identified 8 major themes in John, and was delighted to discover that 5 of them are in John 3:16 and 4 are in John 5:24!

This time was such a gift from the Lord.

# Learning to read... as an adult

Have you ever looked at a document written in a foreign language, and thought about how you would feel if that were actually the language you spoke on a daily basis - but you just couldn't read it? Illiteracy is a major problem across the world, especially among women. In Asia alone, over 250 million women cannot read or write. Vendors, creditors and employers easily take advantage of them; they and their children face safety risks because of their inability to read warning labels; and worst of all they are unable to read God's Word for themselves.



But thankfully, GFA is part of changing that! In 2018 alone, over 60,000 women learned to read and write through GFA's literacy program. Women learn by reading the Bible, which is the

foundational text for the classes, so they gain a knowledge of Scripture even before they've completed the course. Kaavya, one of the women whose life was transformed by the literacy classes, shares her testimony: *"When I joined the literacy class, I learned lots of things. "I learned not only reading and writing; I learned good habits, roles of* 

women, wife and mother in the family. Now I am very happy ... I will not lose heart because I can read and write."
