All hands on deck: StudioEnterprise upgrade

One of the benefits to both of us serving in IT is that we often end up getting to work together on the same projects. Right now the major priority in our department is upgrading StudioEnterprise (our donor database software). This project lasts about two months and heavily involves both of us. Rob is the one coordinating the project, which he has done for the past

several upgrades. Rebecca's part is to coordinate the user testing, keeping track of which items remain to be checked and following up on ones that didn't pass testing.

Rob enjoys the challenge of keeping all the details of the upgrade going, even though sometimes he does feel overwhelmed at the enormity of project. During the intense season of working on the upgrade, it's helpful for us to remember that the purpose of the project is to benefit of GFA staff - many of whom use SE on a daily basis. The newer version has bug fixes and enhancements, which enable the staff to do their jobs more effectively. This upgrade is also an essential step that sets up to make some important software transitions over the next 12 months.

The Value of One Life

With little income and five children, it is challenging for Khine Tun to provide for his family, but he is learning to depend on the Lord to provide for them. His greatest joy is the hope he carries with him of his heavenly home, which enables him to say, "I am happy every day of my life."



After years of enduring difficulties to share the love that burns in his heart, Pastor Myo Zaw has had the joy of seeing 350 people's lives changed by that love. We praise the Lord for so many faithful pastors who are willing to go the extra mile to see one life changed! Their joy also abounds as they see God working powerfully in many lives - one life at a time.
