Meet Jonathan Loghry

An interview with our department coordinator

Q: How long have you been on staff with GFA? **A:** Three years.

Q: What were you doing before you came to GFA? **A:** I worked at a large computer database company, where I had been for 17 years. We also hosted a church in our house, of which I was the primary teaching elder.

Q: What has it been like for your family to be part of the GFA community?

A: Long before we came to GFA, God had impressed on us that it was important that we serve God as a family. Coming here has allowed our family to serve together at a whole different level - it is not only once a week that we share a ministry, but every day of the week. My daughters have really grown in maturity as they have been given training and responsibility in various volunteer roles in the ministry. They love to serve here, and are fully invested in the mission God has given us as a family.

Q: What is your role at GFA?

A: I currently have multiple roles. My primary role is that of "IT Coordinator," which is basically the leader of the IT department. I also handle Network Administration, serve as Business Analyst, and share System and Database Administration with others on the team.

Q: How have you seen God answer prayer?

A: God has answered many prayers for help with practical things in the IT department. For instance, just last week half of our servers went down due to a bad update, and we were able to get them all functioning again before there was really much impact to the staff.

Q: What things have you done with Rob and Rebecca?

A: It has been a joy to watch God develop Rob and
Rebecca's relationship, courtship, and now marriage. I have
four daughters, two of them teenagers, and I am extremely
grateful for how Rob and Rebecca have modeled how to
obtain a spouse in a godly fashion. Of course I have been

involved in many IT projects with Rob and Rebecca over the last few years, and been continually encouraged by their hard work, skill, and beautiful attitude toward work. Having many interactions with Rob and Rebecca in our times of prayer and worship has challenged me to devote myself more to these key aspects of walking with the Lord.

Q: Is there anything that God has spoken to you that you are holding on to?

A: Before coming to GFA, I knew that I needed to have a rock-solid conviction from God that serving at GFA was His direction for my life. Over several months, through scripture and prayer and seeking godly counsel, God convinced everyone but me that this was His direction. Finally, I committed to fast and pray every Friday for several weeks, and asked God to clearly show me His will. One Friday morning while studying in Romans, God spoke to me through Romans 10:13-15: "... And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent?" As I read that passage, God stopped everything and quietly spoke to me: "You send them." I have held on to that through some pretty hard times since then, but God has not changed His direction, and therefore neither have we.

We have really been blessed by Jonathan and his family in numerous ways, and count it a privilege to work under him in the office.

Successful surgery

Thank you so much for praying for Rob and the knee surgery he had in early March. The Lord answered so many prayers before, during, and after the procedure. His peace guarded both of us, which was especially important for Rob. The surgery only took about an hour, and we were able to head home later that afternoon. Rob will have to wear a knee brace for several weeks to protect the ACL ligament while it heals. Rob's recovery is going great, and he's walking around with the knee brace. He's doing an hour a day of knee exercises while listening to lots of audiobooks. Full recovery should take about six months.

Clean Water and the Love of God

Here's a question for you to consider: on average, how many times a day do you walk up to a sink and turn on the faucet? Have you ever considered what you would do if you turned the faucet, and nothing came out? Or what about if you woke up one day to discover that the only place you could get water was from the pond 2 miles from your house? Finding water that will not cause death in the family is a challenge many people in Asia face. Women and children are forced to walk hours a day to distant water sources, such as filthy ponds or lakes, and even then the water may be contaminated.

Sometimes they know this will bring death and sickness to their families, but they have no other choice. Take a look at these facts about the country of India alone:

Worldwide, there are an estimated 663 million people who don't have access to safe water. That's about 1 in every 10 people. Another shocking reality is that 502,000 deaths every year are caused by

diseases transmitted by contaminated water such as diarrhea, cholera, dysentery, typhoid, and polio.


