

Mission Support Team Launch

In our last newsletter we wrote about the Mission Support Team (MST) project that Rob has been coordinating. Thank you for all your prayers as we worked through this major project! It took thousands of hours from staff in many different departments, and more from Rob than any other individual person. But praise God, we were able to meet all the Phase 1 deadlines and the MST web page went public on June 22nd. All the staff gathered together in the Fellowship Hall to watch Rob push the "enter" button, which triggered the Web department's coding that built the page on our website. All of us on staff at GFA are still responsible to raise support to help cover the expense of our serving here, but the MST initiative came about because our



leaders determined there is a need for public sponsorship as well. Raising support constitutes a large draw on our time and energy that affects the critical ministry tasks we do here in the office. It is difficult to raise support to the needed levels; most of the staff are significantly below 100% supported, for various reasons. We ourselves are currently only at 87% of our support level, which we will need to increase over the next few months.

The MST initiative will help cover staff support needs and will also give people another opportunity to be engaged in Kingdom work through giving and praying. We're excited to see how God is working through the body of Christ to bring His good news to the people of Asia!

Indigo = Better Project Coordination

Do you remember a few months ago when we shared about Rob's efforts to implement a project methodology and management tool for GFA? When we first rolled out Indigo (the tool) we knew that it would take a while for people to adopt it, but now his research and extensive documentation have started to pay off. The MST project was the first time we used Indigo to run a major multi-department project from start to finish. Several individuals have recognized that the project wouldn't have been completed on time if we hadn't used Indigo, and now other projects are being started with the intention of modeling their methodology after the MST project. Both Jonathan and Rob invested a lot of time and energy into building this project methodology. Jonathan mainly provided the driving force and inspiration to get it into place, while Rob did most of the groundwork. They are both very gratified to see how their labors are leading the ministry in more competent project management.

1000 Verse Celebration

A couple of months ago our memorization group passed a notable milestone: we reached the 1000th verse memorized! We hosted a 1000 Verse Party at our home, and invited anyone who had at one point or another been part of the group. Megan shared the story of how the group started, and we all got to talk about some of the verses or passages that have been meaningful in our lives. From Opposition to Openness

Even though Sidak displayed kindness, Manali would not budge. She did not approve of his choices in life or his new God. Manali did everything she could to oppose Sidak and his friends, until one day when she was hospitalized.

Having been raised in a home that devoutly worshiped different deities, Manali strongly opposed Christianity. She had no desire to learn about any other faith, and she showed hostility toward the Christians in her community. Even though her son Sidak was aware of his mother's opinions, he responded to the love shown to him by believers in his area and believed in Jesus. When Manali learned about her son's newfound faith, she scolded him and became determined to disrupt any services he was part of and make life complicated for his church family.

When a GFA-supported worker kindly spoke of Jesus to Manali, she was cruel to him and wouldn't listen. Instead she issued threats and angry words. Manali sought ways to eliminate the church. She went to the police and asked them to arrest the Christians. She went to their gatherings to disrupt them and did her best to be a nuisance.

Although Manali strongly opposed the believers, Sidak and his church family remained consistent in praying every day for Manali. They were kind to her whenever they had the opportunity. Sidak knelt before the Lord often and prayed for his mother's heart to be changed. He longed for peace in his relationship with her. The answer to his daily prayers came in an unexpected form. One day, Manali began to have trouble breathing. After a short while, the problem worsened. Manali was admitted to the hospital when she started gasping for air. She suffered from severe asthma and had to be on oxygen. Her



son and the believers visited her at the hospital, caring for her and praying for her healing. In most hospitals in that part of the world, patients' families are expected to bring meals and take care of their loved ones. The very people she vehemently opposed were now taking care of her.

Manali was in a vulnerable position, and her heart began to soften towards those she previously opposed. The kind people continued to love her in spite of her cruelty, and this left a lasting impression on her.

After seeing the consistent acts of compassion, Manali's heart began to soften toward the Christians. Thanks to Sidak's faithfulness, Manali herself eventually asked for prayer. Sidak rejoiced to see a change in her heart. Eventually, her condition improved, and she was able to leave the hospital. As a result of the loving kindness of her son and his church family, she believed in Jesus and plans to be kind toward her fellow believers.
