Changes in IT

Over these past few weeks, we in IT have been in the process of learning a new workflow for our many tasks and projects. Jonathan, our department coordinator, understands the tension that comes from needing to give undivided attention and focus to a multi-step project, while at the same time needing to respond to interruptions and short-term fixes for other issues. Being in IT brings both projects and "interrupt work." He researched extensively for ideas and software we could use to balance these competing responsibilities, and a few weeks ago we officially moved from our old ticketing system to this new workflow.

The overall picture is that during the mornings we knock out "interrupt work" (tickets that don't take long to complete as well as high priority issues), then in the afternoons we focus on projects. There has been a bit of a learning curve, but as we're getting familiar with
